

SCORER RESPONSIBILITIES

Two Scorers are required to score a match. Where possible, both teams should provide a Scorer to assist their Umpire. The Scorer can be a non-playing team member or a spectator.

If one team has a Scorer and the other team does not, then either the Scorer must stand with the scoring Umpire or both Umpires must score. In all instances, the scorers must stand together.

Responsibilities of all Scorers are outlined below:

- Both Scorers will stand and work together, at a place designated by the Umpires. This could be either on the side-line or goal-line dependent upon health and safety for everyone courtside
- Both Scorers will record each goal scored on their issued Score Card
- One Scorer will call the score after each goal, who this is should be agreed prior to the start of the match
- If there is any discrepancy with the score, the Scorers should try and rectify it between them. If the Scorers are unable to resolve the issue, they should inform the nearest Umpire as soon as possible, who will if necessary stop the game and confer with their co-Umpire before the match continues
- On the final whistle the Scorer should ensure that their Team Captain accompanies them to the Umpire in order for Score Card to be promptly completed by inserting the final score, which will be the official score for the match
